

In our What was life like in Tudor England? History unit we will be learning about:

- Which of Henry's wives were most suitable
- Why people married in the Tudor period
- Why a baby boy was so important for Royal progression
- How to analyse a primary source
- How to consider different historical bigses



In our What is life like in the alps? Geography unit we will be learning about:



- Locate the Alps on a world map and identify and label the eight countries they spread through.
- Locate three physical and three human characteristics in the Alps.
- Research and describe the physical and human features of Innsbruck.
- Use a variety of data collection methods

In <u>Art</u>, we will be exploring the topic illustration and imagination. We will study the work and processes of professional illustrators and experiment with our own styles, ideas and techniques. This topic will help us to develop our problem solving skills through activities such as responding to words through art and working from a brief.

In Music pupils will be:

Exploring composition and different musical notation Studying The Blues a s a style of music and performing

English

Our first Talk for Writing unit will be based on the true story, 'Hidden Figures'. We'll be developing our non-fiction writing skills by working on producing an information text, with a focus on vocabulary and sentence structure. We will be developing our reading skills through daily lessons, studying the texts 'Freedom' and 'Once'.

There will be continuing focus on Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar.

Maths

Understand, compare and solve number and practical problems Explore calculation strategies for large number problems, reasoning towards appropriate operations and methods.

Read and interpret information presented in tables and line graphs
Solve problems involving converting between units of time
Solve problems using known facts, knowledge of factors, primes, squares and cubes and combinations of operations.

Calculate and compare the perimeter and area; estimate areas of non-rectilinear shapes.

In <u>Character Curriculum</u>, we will be learning about:

In <u>PE</u>, we will be learning about: Football! We have been learning a range of different skills and football drills which we can use in match play and on 1 v 1 bases. Next half term we will be looking at Netball/basketball.

Worship and The true meaning of Christmas In Spanish, we'll be learning:

<u>Describing family and friends</u>

Looking at a family tree, children find out the vocabulary for family members and use different verbs to write a description of them

Spanish portraits

Describing portraits, applying knowledge of noun-adjective agreement to plural nouns.

In Computing, we will be learning about:

Sharing Information(IT): computer systems and communication.
Digital Literacy(DL) positive online communication and being responsible digital creators
